Instructions for Authors

About the paper

The paper which you submit to Revista del Ciclo Económico (RCE) should make an original contribution to the *history, economic thought, theory, and empirical evidence* of business cycles, which has not been published elsewhere and none of the authors should have other work either published or under consideration elsewhere which significantly reduces the original content of the work submitted to RCE. In the event that an Editor notices, or a referee points out, that there is a possible overlap with another paper, consideration of the paper will be suspended while the author is asked to explain the relationship between the (two) papers.

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All correspondence on submissions to the journal must be through the submissions site or to the RCE evaluation office at revistadelcicloeconomico@gmail.com. This ensures the speediest response to any queries you might have.

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The authors will be required to send in one mail, three files (one optional)

1. Covering letter and the CV or resume. Please address your letter to 'The Editors, Revista del Ciclo Económico' and not to an individual Editor as he may not be the one who is assigned to your paper. Please state in your letter whether or not you wish your paper to be reviewed anonymously. Please also state whether there is any other dissemination of the paper, for example as a working paper. The CV or resume will be no longer than 10 pages.

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Those who want to comment working papers about the (preferred emerging economies) business cycles: economic thought, history, theory and empirical evidence, must send us in one mail: i) The working paper; ii) Her/His resume, and iii) The comments of the paper, to: revistadelcicloeconomico@gmail.com , writing in the subject line: 'WP reviewer: name of the paper'.

The length of an article will be the lesser between 5 thousands words or 10 pages.

Example:

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Subject: WP Reviewer The Political Business Cycles After 25 years.

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The evaluation period is limited, we adopt the *45 days rule (45dr)*, it is, 45 days after you sent the articles, we will inform you by email if it has been accepted or not.

When the Paper is Accepted for Publication

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We adopt the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (6th Ed.) for the papers published in our Journal (RCE), except with the three differences listed below:

1. The font must be Arial, 12 for the text and 10 for the footnotes

2. The color should be blue and the text should be justify.
3. Twice abstract will be required one in English and the other in Spanish and will not exceed 150 words.

Abstract

Prices and Production (1931) is the work in which Hayek develops Mises contributions to the theory of economic fluctuations (1912). Although relegated in main academic circles as theoretical support to respond to the causes of the Crisis of '29 by the nascent Keynesian revolution, Hayek contributions contain, as well as the Latin American current: the concept of structure. Through this we will establish, the existence (or not) of axiomatic compatibilizations between the Austrian theory of fluctuations with the contribution of the Latin American thought regarding the fluctuations of the periphery as behavioral effects in the core economies. Our work is therefore confined to the economic context and the State of art of the economic thought existing between the end of the roaring twenties and the Bretton Woods after period.

Resumen

Prices and Production (1931) es la obra en la cual Hayek desarrolla los aportes de Mises a la teoría de las fluctuaciones económicas (1912). Aunque relegadas en los círculos académicos principales como sustento teórico para dar respuesta a las causas de la Crisis del '29 por la naciente Revolución Keynesiana, los aportes de Hayek contienen, al igual que la corriente latinoamericana: el concepto de estructura. Por medio de este estableceremos la existencia (o no) de compatibilizaciones axiomáticas entre la teoría de las fluctuaciones austríaca con el aporte del pensamiento latinoamericano respecto a las fluctuaciones de la periferia como efectos del comportamiento en la economías centrales. Nuestro trabajo entonces, se circunscribe al contexto económico y al estado de arte del pensamiento económico vigente entre el fin de los *roaring twinties* y el periodo post Bretton Woods.
