***“Economics for the Good Society”***

Social Economics investigates the relationships between the economy and society and focuses on issues relevant to economic policy. We invite proposals for papers which address the economic, social, and ethical implications of policy, as well as questions such as:

- What is the good society, and what economic policy can facilitate its achievement?
- How can policy be used to achieve full employment and a sustainable economy?
- How can economic policy contribute to an equitable distribution of income and wealth?
- How can the public services offered by government be equitably and efficiently provided?
- How can economic and financial institutions be designed and organized to serve the good society?
- What is responsible policy concerning the environment in a good society?
- How should the good society address problems concerning the elderly, the young, the vulnerable, and others unable to provide for themselves?
- What is responsible policy concerning health care and education in a good society?
- How should the good society address problems concerning immigration, migration, and migrants?
- How can the negative effects of globalization be addressed in a good society? What is responsible action regarding the economic and social well-being of the poor of the world?

Individuals whose papers are accepted for presentation must either be or become members, not later than July 1, 2010, of the Association for Social Economics, ASE, in order for the paper to be included in the program. The *Warren Samuels Prize*, which is accompanied with a \$500 award, is given to the paper which is of best quality and which is important to the project of social economics, with appeal across disciplines. The prize is awarded at the annual meeting following the one at which it is presented.
