## AWARDS and PRIZES

The Association has established awards, prizes, and a research grant, some of which are named in honor of five distinguished members. These awards call attention to the achievements and contributions of select members of the Association and provide support and encouragement for promising scholars in social economics.

### HELEN POTTER AWARD

The Helen Potter Award, created and endowed in 1975, is presented each year to a promising scholar of social economics for authoring the best article in *The Review of Social Economy*. This award is accompanied with a \$500 prize.

### SPRINGER PRIZE

The Springer Prize is presented to the person who authors the best article in *The Forum for Social Economics* during the year. The award is accompanied with a \$500 prize.

### LUDWIG MAI SERVICE AWARD

Since 1983 the Ludwig Mai Service Award has been presented periodically to a person who has given exceptional service to the Association.

### THOMAS DIVINE AWARD

The Thomas Divine Award, founded in 1986, is presented annually to a member who has made important lifetime contributions to social economics. It is accompanied with a \$1,000 prize.

### WILLIAM R. WATERS

#### SUMMER RESEARCH GRANT

The William R. Waters Research Grant was established in 1999 and was first awarded for Summer, 2000. The research grant is for promising new faculty members who have not yet been granted tenure and graduate students in Ph.D. programs who have not yet completed their dissertation. Application information is available on the website. The deadline is in November before the summer to which the grant applies.

## ANNUAL MEETINGS

Meetings are held once a year in conjunction with the Allied Social Science Associations, usually during the first week in January. The Association for Social Economics hosts an Opening Plenary Session and Reception on the evening before the start of the sessions. Awards are announced at the Annual Business Meeting and at the Presidential Breakfast.

### WARREN SAMUELS PRIZE

This prize is awarded to a paper presented at the January ASSA meetings that best exemplifies scholarly work which:

Is of high quality,

Is important to the project of social economics, and

Has broad appeal across disciplines.

While it is preferable that the submitted paper is presented at one of the ASSA sessions sponsored by the Association for Social Economics, papers from all sessions are qualified. The winning paper may, subject to peer review, be published in the subsequent September issue of the *Review of Social Economy*. The winner of the Samuels Prize receives a \$500 award.

### OTHER CONFERENCES/MEETINGS

The Association from time to time sponsors special conferences on topics of particular interest to the members. The World Congress for Social Economics is held every three years.

Regional directors of the Association arrange sessions for the presentation and discussion of papers with the Southwest Economics Association, the Eastern Economics Association, the Midwest Economics Association, and with the Western Economics Association. Information is available on the website.
