By kind agreement of the AHE Committee, PKSG proposes to organise a series of sessions with a Post Keynesian perspective on the AHE conference theme (*Heterodox Economics and Sustainable Development, 20 years on*) and on other issues of interest to participants. The intention is to create an attractive opportunity for Post Keynesian economists to meet in the UK in the alternate year to the Kansas City (US) workshop and to engage in discussions, both in their particular field of interest and also with other participants approaching issues of common interest from different perspectives.

In order to achieve this dual objective, we hope that at least one session at any time in the parallel streams of the conference will have a distinctively Post Keynesian theme, while bearing in mind the overall aim of the conference to encourage dialogue between a variety of viewpoints and disciplines. In particular, the plenary sessions, at a minimum, will allow Post Keynesians to work with economists from other perspectives in addressing particular questions.

The PKSG Committee invites proposals for individual papers and complete sessions in accordance with these aims. Please see the guidelines for submission in the AHE's main Call for Papers (attached). Note that PKSG's role is solely in the organisation of this conference theme and prospective participants will also need to register independently with the AHE conference organisers. The main difference is that proposals for papers and sessions should be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of PKSG by email to secretary@postkeynesian.net.

Deadlines:

- for submission of proposals: 8 February 2009
- for complete papers: 3 May 2009
- for registration: 7 June 2009.

Suggestions of topics for sessions are also welcome, as soon as possible, so that we can circulate these ideas and invite individual papers to address them.
