The craving for exactness and rigor, that characterizes so many efforts undertaken in mainstream economics, has transformed over the past decades from a focus on formal-analytical rigor towards an emphasis on ‚clean identification‘ of (allegedly) ‚causal‘ effects. And while the ghosts of formal-deductive reasoning still linger, this change had a profound impact on the discipline: in some way it changed the nature of the discipline (from more rationalist to more empiricist) and impacted prevailing methodological standards as well as dominant policy views (e.g. on the minimum wage) within the profession.

I observed this transformation not only in my role as a part-time historian of thought, but also as a real-life witness, because this transformation was quite visible in the economics department of the Johannes Kepler University, my alma mater. This department started out as a somewhat pluralist econ department in the 1970s (with [Rothschild](#)<sup>4</sup>, [Laszki](#)<sup>5</sup> or [Riese](#)<sup>6</sup> as key figures) but had transformed into a conventional mainstream department by the time I arrived as a student some thirty years later. Over the decades I have become involved in the Linz econ department in various ways: as a student, as a lecturer, as an observer, as a colleague, as a PhD-advisor and the like...

The econ department in Linz was an interesting microcosm to observe this transition and the consequences it entailed: new priorities in the teaching canon, a change away from core econ topics towards „whatever brings good data meriting publication“ and, of course, changing standards in the evaluation of research and thereby also shifts in internal hierarchy. And while I was highly skeptical about the constraints imposed by the empirical turn on young econ researchers on very narrow, data-driven and career-instrumental paths, I could see how thinking about identification was – in some way – probably better than writing up the random, a-theoretical or all-too-simple-minded exercises that coined my (more old-school) econometrics-classes.

Aside from that, I always had the impression that there is a common denominator between the mainstream drive for identification and the heterodox notion of pluralism. Both care, albeit in different ways, about multi-causality and the complexity it brings. Research designs are employed in the hope of isolating a clear-cut relationship within a mess of causal pathways. Pluralism’s inherent contribution is to raise awareness about

exactly that mess — and to insist that thinking without dogma is a necessary condition for illuminating complexity.

Just a few weeks ago, the person I considered the main architect of the empirical turn at the Linz econ department, [Rudi Winter-Ebmer](#)<sup>7</sup>, retired and on this occasion I was invited to contribute to a „book of abstracts“ that collects ideas on papers that we could have written jointly with Rudi, but have never actually done so.

As you might imagine, I took this opportunity to reflect on the above intuition and contributed the short abstract shared below, which reflects on how this alleged complementarity between the key intuition behind the empirical turn and the notion of pluralism in heterodox economics could play out in practice.

*Causality and Pluralism (An extended abstract)*

*The credibility revolution in econometrics has delivered powerful tools for causal analysis and with them a new standard of local, internally valid causal claims. Yet precision, however admirable, is not the same as understanding. A coefficient, no matter how cleanly identified, does not interpret itself; and a finding, no matter how robust, may bring quite different implications if we dare to shift our theoretical frame of reference.*

*In addressing this key conundrum, this paper argues that causal econometrics and pluralist economic methodology are in fact natural complements – and that bringing them into dialogue addresses a surprisingly obvious gap in both literatures.*

*Drawing on a critical-rationalist epistemology, we emphasize that no single hypothesis, however well-identified, can exhaust the space of relevant explanations for complex economic phenomena. Competing and complementary hypotheses are not a nuisance, but a resource: their systematic comparison enhances external validity, internal coherence and theoretical robustness, by forcing researchers to specify the scope conditions and mechanisms that make a causal story credible in the first place. Conversely, pluralist economics gains from engaging with the demand for well-defined counterfactuals and identification strategies, which serves as a productive input when distinguishing pluralism-with-rigor from pluralism-as-anything-goes.*

*On this foundation, we sketch a framework in which the local precision of modern causal econometrics and the broader ambition of pluralist contextualization are treated not as rivals but as mutually reinforcing research strategies. The result, we suggest, is better economics: more honest about what a given study can and cannot establish, more attentive to the institutional and theoretical embeddedness of causal claims, and — perhaps*

Decolonial Comparative Law Workshop (Douala, May 2027)

### **Workshop theme: Decolonial Comparative Law and the Informal/Formal Economy**

The exclusion of the many from access to, and the benefits of, means of production and resources has long been a colonial enterprise. Today, around 60% of the world's labour force works in the informal economy. In legal terms, informality often translates into insecure social and economic rights – in short, precarity. At the same time, legal instruments designed to secure transactions, access to capital, and property are typically associated with the formal economy. Yet across Global South – or Global Majority – contexts, and increasingly in the Global North, participation in the formal economy does not guarantee stable economic rights.

This is paralleled by an exclusion of the informal economy within comparative law scholarship, which either ignores informality altogether or views it merely as a problem to be solved by law modelled after Global North law. This imbalance has limited the documentation of alternative legal instruments for human economies. Coloniality continues to sustain a narrow reading of how Global South and Indigenous societies structure their economic lives, including when they choose not to practise “economy” in a conventional sense. Acknowledging the heterogeneity of the informal economy requires attention to everyday legalities across both informal and formal work.

This workshop is not only interested in papers recommending or problematising formalisation initiatives. The main focus of the workshop is to take the informal economy seriously as a space of legality as such, in the context of legal pluralism. The organizers are looking for attempts to document, compare, and assess legal approaches – in formal and informal law – to the informal economy and the intersections between formal and informal economic life. The organizers welcome papers analysing how informal workers mobilise, transform, ignore, or reject state and non-state legal instruments in their economic lives, and examining how formal institutions engage with the informal sector.

Potential topics include, but are not limited to:

- Informal cross-border trade, including commerce conducted by groups transcending state borders, regardless of their legality under state law.
- Local and digital currencies created or used for noncolonial purposes.
- Indigenous and customary economies, including their own value systems, exchange practices, and non-colonial monetary forms.
- Ecofeminist, pastoralist, rural, and intentional communities (e.g. Auroville in India) as well as precolonial or other traditional modes of value creation (irrespective of the effective ancestry of the practice).
- Labour rights in informal work, including economic dependence within and beyond the employer–employee relationship, dispute resolution practices, and collective organisation (e.g., trade unions, associations, cooperatives).
- Microlending, alternative securities, and property rights as mechanisms for accessing capital.
- Legal (mis)recognition of informal workers.
- Migration and the (in)formal economy.
- Globalisation and the informal labour serving the global supply chain.

- Digital businesses, platform-based livelihoods (e.g. TikTok influencers, delivery and domestic workers hired online) and (in)formality.
- State constraints on local economic sovereignty, including the spatial distribution and regulation of formal and informal economic activities.
- Blurred lines between formal and informal economies: workers operating in both settings (e.g. civil servants' side jobs; or 'hustlers', 'débrouillards', and 'rebuscadores').

If your research does not fit into any of these themes, the organizers still encourage you to submit a proposal. In general, the organizers invite papers that analyse and destabilise coloniality by examining, comparatively, the economic and legal imaginaries through which communities (typically, but not necessarily, in the Global South) define, practise, or decline to practise an economy beyond (or in spite of) coloniality.

### JAPE No. 99 Special Issue: The Political Economy of Health Inequality

Over the preceding two decades, mainstream public health scholarship and political discourse has accorded increasing attention to health inequalities – both their pernicious effects on population health and well-being, and the need to devise policies to redress them. Most prominently, this focus has translated into an expansive literature addressing the social determinants of health (SDH), which recognises that health outcomes stem from myriad social factors beyond healthcare alone, and are not reducible to the products of economically organised medical science. Alternatively, in seeking to discern the complex determinants of human health and inequalities therein, this tradition highlights the importance of indicators of socio-economic status (SES), such as income, wealth, and education. SDH research predominantly isolates such indicators as a means to demonstrate their causal association with negative and/or positive health outcomes, thereby implying that securing the correct balance of SES indicators would precipitate more favourable societal and/or global health consequences.

Undoubtedly, the SDH literature has heightened analytical and public awareness of injustices surrounding health and health delivery – a fact that was plainly evident during successive COVID waves, as the relations between inequality and ill-health became increasingly stark. Without pre-existing, broad institutional acceptance of the association of SES with health status among public health institutions, researchers, hospitals, and international organisations, discussions concerning inequality and COVID would not have occurred with such potency within media and governmental circles. Nevertheless, despite this important contribution in identifying a broad nexus of social factors shaping health outcomes, the SDH literature tends to disregard the ‘upstream’ social conditions and power structures that adversely affect health. That is, the tradition largely fails to progress further up the causal chain to address how the social determinants of poor health (such as inequality) are, themselves, determined by structural factors, such as class or the systemic imperative of capitalism toward perpetual capital accumulation. Inequality or socioeconomic status here simply refers to individuals or families who are higher or lower according to a particular metric without consideration of the antagonistic social relations between these groups.

Hence, while recognising the significance of SDH research in refocusing scholarly and political attention on social factors as the fulcrum of studies of health inequality, this special issue seeks to shift how we comprehend associations between inequality and health. It places the locus of causality not so much on socio-economic status, but rather on the embodied structural forces, power, and political struggles that bring about the proximate status of SES indicators in the first place. That is, it is concerned with the political economy of health inequalities – critically analysing the historically specific nexus of structures, processes, and social relations in contemporary capitalism that constitute the material and ideological conditions in which people live and work, and thereby engender particular individual and societal patterns of health, illness, and well-being.

Contributions to this special issue may address a range of questions on this theme, including (but not limited to):

- Conceptualising health inequality via a political economy lens
- Financialisation, the asset economy and health inequality
- The corporatisation of Medicare, de-universalisation and growth of out-of-pocket health expenses
- Climate change, planetary health and health inequalities
- Food poverty and malnutrition
- The co-constitutive relations between class, gender, sexual, racialised and spatial health inequalities

- Corporate power, neoliberalism and the commodification of health
- Methodological approaches to studying health inequality that address its structural causes
- The contemporary welfare/workfare state and entrenching of poverty
- Contesting the primarily techno-managerial framing of health inequalities in government policy
- Capitalism, class struggle and health
- Case-studies of health inequalities in Australia and/or globally
- Policy and political opportunities to promote greater social justice – from universal basic services and greater healthcare universalism to structural and systemic change

Through consideration of such themes, the special issue will showcase the cutting-edge of contemporary scholarship on the political economy of health inequality. Papers should be between 6,000-8,000 words, and formatted using the Harvard style.

### **What Should Central Banks Do?**

Central banks were first designed to deal with financial instability and to give economic and financial support to governments by funding public debt. This was their primary *raison d'être*. The earliest institutions, like the Bank of England (1694), were established specifically to finance military conflicts and manage national treasuries. Later, banks like the U.S. Federal Reserve (1913) were created as "lenders of last resort" to stop bank panics and standardize currency. As time went on, however, central banks were called upon to assume additional tasks, notably the responsibility for keeping inflation 'low and stable' and for addressing unemployment.

Viewed from the periphery, this question cannot be separated from the hierarchical nature of the global monetary and financial system. That hierarchy shapes even central banks' 'core' objectives, so what is at stake is less the addition of new mandates than the degree of monetary sovereignty peripheral capitalist states possess in the first place.

Today, as research has progressed and new economic challenges have arisen, central banks are being called upon once more — from various ideological sides — to address issues of inequality and the environment, and to participate in quantitative easing for the people.

But are central banks able to address all these issues? Or, more importantly, should they? In the end, are we not asking central banks to do too much? Should central banks address income inequality? Should they address ecological problems, and, above all, should they distribute money to the general public?

It is of course one thing to recognize that monetary policy has distributive or ecological consequences, but asking central banks to address these issues is a matter of great debate. Does this fall into the mainstream trap of accepting 'monetary policy dominance', as coined by Rochon and Setterfield? Are central banks equipped to deal with these additional problems, or should they be relegated to fiscal policy?

Such is the question posed by this joint symposium between the Review of Political Economy and Economia e Sociedade. Our aim is to publish a total of twenty articles

The Journal of Critical Economics announces a call for papers for its semi-monographic issue for the second half of 2027 on 'Transformations of contemporary capitalism: neoliberalism, authoritarianism and the war economy'.

For decades, analysis of capitalist economies has focused on neoliberalism as the emerging order that emerged from the crisis of the 1970s, centred on deregulation, financialisation and globalisation. However, this project — which has always been marked by social

resistance and differing national trajectories — has shown clear limitations since the 2007 crisis, following which austerity policies reinforced inequalities and weakened the material foundations of democracy.

Neoliberalism has operated not only as an economic policy, but also as an institutional project and a rationale that reshapes the conditions of democracy, fostering processes of de-democratisation, technocratisation and authoritarianism. In this context, rising inequality, the ecological crisis and the transformations of digital capitalism are combined with the rise of the far right and a growing structural convergence between neoliberalism and new forms of fascism.

At the same time, we are witnessing significant shifts in the role of the state and in global regulation: directed reindustrialisation, a crisis of multilateralism, geopolitical tensions and the intensification of armed conflicts, and a slowdown in ecological transition policies... Within this framework, we are seeing a return to active fiscal policies and the emergence of a possible ‘war-time Keynesianism’, in which defence spending acts as a driver of demand, innovation and productive reorganisation.

Whilst inequalities continue to grow and affect the living conditions of an increasing proportion of the population, even in the dominant countries, new types of business have emerged which wield significant economic power through their control of the central networks of the new digital economy. The debate over how to characterise this new form of capitalism is ongoing, with concepts such as ‘surveillance capitalism’ or ‘techno-feudalism’ being put forward in an attempt to capture the nature of a new model that is more predatory than its predecessor. At the same time, driven by the United States, we are witnessing the dismantling of plurinational institutions and a resurgence of imperial and military tensions. A key aspect of this process is the weakening of policies designed to tackle ecological problems. Growing inequalities, the ecological crisis, imperialist conflicts and the rise of a far right that imposes policies aimed at dismantling rights paint a dramatic picture.

The aim of this special issue is to analyse these transformations, their causes and their direction, taking into account both the continuities and the breaks with historical neoliberalism.

The following lines of inquiry, amongst others, are proposed:

- Relationships between neoliberalism, the democratic crisis, authoritarianism and fascism
- The political economy of war: military spending, reindustrialisation and military Keynesianism
- Transformations of the state and the global order in a context of geopolitical rivalry

- Digital capitalism, corporate power and new forms of accumulation
- Finance, inequality and the reconfiguration of social structures
- The ecological crisis and the limits of the growth model
- The role of China and new configurations of the international system
- Elements for characterising contemporary capitalism

Theoretical and empirical contributions from critical and interdisciplinary perspectives will be welcomed.

**Conference theme: Working nature – exploring intersections of labour history and political ecology**

The 61st ITH Conference is organized by the International Conference of Labour and Social History (ITH) and kindly supported by the Chamber of Labour of Upper Austria, the Chamber of Labour of Vienna, the Institute for Historical Social Research, the Friedrich Ebert Foundation, the Austrian Society for Political Education, and the City of Linz.

The bundle of human-made ecological crises has reached a point where most earth scientists see an actual breaching of ecological thresholds, not only in relation to climate change but also six of nine processes for which “planetary boundaries” have been de-

fined. In this context, the interdisciplinary field of political ecology (which dates to at least the 1970s) has experienced a spectacular boom. In a certain sense, it has become the interdisciplinary critical social science of our days, a field in which both academic and political concerns converge. In the English-speaking world, political ecology has proved to be strongly inflected by historical reasoning, with several authors highlighting the entanglements between material extraction, energy carriers (particularly fossil ones), ecological over-use, capitalist economic development, and exploitation.

While the history of work and labour relations have a place in these studies, many commentators have noticed an ongoing non-communication between labour history and political ecology. Despite such (self-)critical assessments, the last decades already have seen numerous instances scholarship at the intersection of “labour” and “environmental history” as well as “political ecology”. It thus seems both timely and necessary to bring global labour history and historical political ecology into a more structured and fruitful dialogue, to assess existing research at the intersection of both and to explore further avenues of research. While open to a broad spectrum of topics and approaches – from the carbon nexus to agrarian ecologies, from toxic through contested to multispecies labour –, this conference will insist on “labour” as one major category of differentiation in past and current ecological predicaments.

### **Overcoming Lock-Ins to Enable a Just Transition towards a Climate-Neutral and Sustainable Economy and Society**

The PhD Fall School 2026 brings together doctoral researchers from different disciplinary backgrounds to explore this question in an interdisciplinary and collaborative learning environment. The programme focuses on analysing lock-ins and their interconnectedness across socio-technical systems, while developing strategies and intervention pathways for transformative change.

Participants will work in interdisciplinary teams focusing on specific production and consumption systems, including:

- agricultural food systems,

- industrial production and consumption,
- transport systems,
- and energy systems.

The Fall School combines keynote lectures, input-focused and workshop elements, collaborative research, and interdisciplinary exchange.

Throughout the week, participants will analyse lock-ins, discuss approaches for operationalisation and measurement, and collaboratively develop measures and strategies for overcoming lock-ins in the context of just sustainability transitions. Each team will be accompanied by faculty mentors throughout the week.

The Fall School is designed for doctoral researchers interested in sustainability transitions, climate neutrality, socio-technical change, and interdisciplinary research. In addition to thematic and analytical insights, participants will strengthen their interdisciplinary collaboration, critical thinking, communication, and collaborative research skills.

The programme corresponds to 4 ECTS credits and includes the collaborative development of a short interdisciplinary research paper following the Fall School. Active participation throughout the entire Fall School programme is expected.

### **Special Issue of *Organization***

Amidst the many crises of the 21st century, there has been a multi-stranded return to Marx across not only the critical social sciences and humanities but within broader struggles for social transformation. In different ways, these have stretched Marxian concepts and methods to examine the changing, contradictory, and uneven nature of capitalist organization and organizing against capital. This includes engagement with previously

unknown or neglected texts and themes in Marx's oeuvre, that address questions of ecology, colonialism, gender, sexuality, and more. Despite these developments, and despite the influence that Marx has had on the study of organization and organizing, direct and sustained engagement with Marxian theory remains limited within organization studies. The special issue therefore seeks to open a forum for engagement with new readings and uses of Marx, to think and struggle in the open and unknown terrain of history. We invite conceptual, methodological, and empirical contributions that critically engage with Marx, from a plurality of disciplines, traditions, geographies, and positionalities, to interrogate capitalist organization in the conjuncture and explore possibilities for organizing alternatives in and beyond capitalism.

Paper development workshops for interested authors will be held in November 2026. There will be an in-person PDW in London, UK on November 4th 2026, and an online PDW in mid- to late November 2026 for those who are unable to attend in-person. The format of the workshops will be finalized closer to the time they are held.

28 September - 02 October, 2026 — Maastricht, Netherlands

Agent-based models (ABM) are a powerful and increasingly essential tool in economics and across other social sciences for studying complex systems and social challenges. This summer school addresses the critical need for researchers to master not only the conceptual underpinnings of ABM but also the practical challenges of programming, adhering to robust protocols, and effectively communicating model design and results.

Building on [past successful editions](#)<sup>29</sup>, this intensive, full-time course equips participants with the advanced theoretical understanding and skills to design, implement, validate, and analyse robust agent-based models, such as a PhD thesis, a high-quality academic paper, or a policy report.

In this edition the course will also evaluate the power and limitations of Large Language Models (LLM) as co-pilots in designing and coding ABMs. In an era where researchers increasingly turn to LLM to generate code, this course emphasises the critical importance of understanding model mechanics. By comparing AI-generated models with manual coding, students will appreciate the need for bridging theory and implementation.

While the methodological skills acquired are applicable across all social sciences, the primary case studies will focus on economics, innovation, development, political economy, public policy and structural change.

Upon completion, participants will be able to:

- Understand the foundational principles and theoretical frontiers of ABMs, including their strengths and limitations in social science research.
- Design and implement ABMs from scratch in and R, abstracting away from tedious software engineering to focus purely on modelling logic.
- Analyse model output rigorously and apply Machine Learning methods for advanced sensitivity analysis with R.
- Develop skills useful to produce ABMs also in other platforms/languages such as Python and NetLogo.
- Critically compare AI-generated ABMs with expert manual coding in R and LSD, recognizing the methodological risks of treating simulation code as a black box.

- Critically evaluate ABM methodology, navigate the pitfalls of relying on AI for model generation, and apply this learning to their own research questions.
- Conceptualise and prototype an original ABM project, laying a strong foundation for future development and publication.

This course is designed for:

- Ambitious graduate and PhD students in economics and other social sciences with a keen interest in advancing their research using computational methods.
- Early-career researchers and experienced modellers looking to enhance their skills and explore new frontiers in ABMs.

Places are limited to 16 participants to ensure a high-quality learning experience and ample interaction with faculty. WAPE conference on 'The Wealth of Nations in the Multipolar Age' (London, August 2026)

5-7 August, 2026 — London, UK

The World Association for Political Economy (WAPE) is pleased to announce its annual forum on the theme “*The Wealth of Nations* in the Multipolar Age”, marking the 250th anniversary of the publication of Adam Smith’s *The Wealth of Nations*. Participants meet at the Old Royal Naval College in Greenwich, London, where the first Chinese translator of the Smith’s works and first principal of Beijing University, Yan Fu, studied.

The organizers invite scholars, researchers, activists, and practitioners to participate in the conference.

The neoclassical and neoliberal appropriation of Smith is simplistic at best and false at worst. Marx, in contrast, rightly regarded Smith as one of his most important intellectual

forbears, whose ideas he both valued and criticized in arriving at his own critique of political economy.

Marx considered Smith to be among those investigating ‘the real internal framework [*Zusammenhang*] of bourgeois relations of production’ — in particular, through his concept of the division of labour, at once advancing the productive capacities of human labour and stunting the human personality, and his belief that labour was ‘the real measure of the exchangeable value of all commodities’.

Indeed, the centrality of these and other themes of Smith’s work to Marx’s indicates that many of them point beyond capitalism itself.

*The Wealth of Nations* also addressed, as the curtain rose on the modern capitalist world, the central issue of what makes nations rich or poor. It has formed the running thread of the study of political and geopolitical economy. Today it is central to discussions of the multipolar and pluripolar world, as socialist and other anti-imperialist countries challenge capitalist domination through the increasingly successful pursuit of development, combined with a rejection of the imperial domination that was formative of, and remains fundamental to, capitalism’s very existence.

As in previous years, WAPE will run a geopolitical economy stream to strengthen understanding of what Marx called the ‘relations of producing nations’ of the age of capital, and of the transition away from capitalism.

The organizers commemorate Smith’s *The Wealth of Nations* this year by inviting submissions that add to existing scholarship on Smith, particularly those that develop the radical and developmental aspects of his thought in the spirit of Marxism, those that investigate his relation to Marx and other critical thinkers since and especially those that which investigate how reconsideration of Smith’s work may contribute to understanding the political and geopolitical economy of the twenty-first century of decaying capitalism, and to advancing socialism in what Marx termed the ‘relations of producing nations’ in the age of multi- and pluripolarity.

## **PhD position - '(Dis)orderly transitions: The financial sector's role in shaping just energy transitions'**

### **What the project is about**

In recent years the idea of an 'orderly just transition' has started to gain ground. While questions of justice have been taken up by 'just transition' research, the addition of 'orderly' is more recent, raising new questions around the envisioned speed, direction, and outcomes of energy transitions. In this project we want to look at this idea of 'order' in transitions more closely, identifying and analysing how (some) actors in the financial sector try to implement an orderly transition away from fossil fuels through the use of specific financial instruments and practices. By incorporating ideas from both political economy and economic sociology the project investigates how attempts at enacting order by financial actors can be understood as a process of contested temporal politics, with actors seeking to make the future knowable, trajectories towards it manageable, and outcomes controllable.

The project is a collaboration between myself (Bregje van Veelen, Lund University) and [Amy Janzwood<sup>44</sup>](#) at McGill University in Canada, and will include cases in both North America and Scandinavia. The PhD candidate in Lund is expected to focus primarily on the latter, but there will be opportunity for comparative work too. The position is based at LUCSUS (Lund University Centre for Sustainability Studies) in Sweden, where you will be part of a friendly and supportive community of scholars.

### **What the institution is looking for in a candidate**

Someone with a strong interest in critical social science approaches who is excited to explore how issues of politics and power play out in the financial sphere. The project speaks to a variety of themes and concepts, including energy transitions, sustainable finance, temporalities & future-making, and social constructions of risk. The institution does not expect anyone to be experienced with all of these, but having experience with one of these topics and an interest in some of the others is important. ### **Funded PhD Studentship: Water Governance, Legal Frameworks and Regional Outcomes**

With public trust at an all-time low, following regular spills of raw sewage into rivers and waterways, England and Wales face a deepening crisis in their water systems rooted in decades of policy choices, regulatory failure, and the structural tensions of a privatised industry.

Following the Independent Water Commission’s final report in July 2025, the government has committed to a major overhaul of the regulatory architecture in England, including a single integrated water regulator. Wales is considering parallel reforms, while Scotland continues with a publicly owned model. This moment of institutional change creates an opportunity to examine how legal and regulatory design shapes outcomes for regions, communities, and the wider stakeholders involved.

The UK’s three jurisdictions, operating within broadly comparable physical and economic environments, offer meaningfully different combinations of ownership, regulation and governance philosophy. The reform underway enables comparison between the emerging English architecture and the longer-established Scottish and Welsh models.

The studentship invites research into questions such as:

- whether ownership structure explains differences in investment, environmental performance, and the spatial distribution of costs and benefits.
- whether embedding water governance within wider statutory frameworks, such as the Wellbeing of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015, shapes outcomes.
- whether integrated regulation, as England is now developing, alters capacity to address cross-cutting challenges including catchment management, agricultural pollution, and climate adaptation.
- whether legal innovation like the recognition of rights of nature holds a transformative potential, and how governance arrangements generally distribute costs and benefits across regions, communities, and stakeholders as climate pressures intensify.

The Steering Committee of the Union for Radical Political Economics (URPE) is pleased to announce that the 2026 URPE Dissertation Fellow is Lingyi Wei, doctoral candidate in the Department of Economics at the University of Utah.

Lingyi's dissertation is titled "Understanding the Structure of the Capitalist World-System" and its main purpose is to analyze patterns of global inequalities in income distribution among countries. She develops a common relational benchmark for measuring the hierarchical structure of the capitalist world-system, constructs a Labor Terms of Trade, and analyzes the extent to which this measure of unequal exchange mirrors this hierarchy. Her completed dissertation will contribute to analyses of the necessary institutional changes to alter the existing and persistent inequalities.

As in previous years, URPE received promising and worthwhile applications from doctoral candidates at top universities on three continents, and regret that URPE can support only one annual fellow when there are so many excellent applicants in need of support.
